Step into Elsah Galleries in the Mott Building on Lasalle Street, and you'll discover an amazing array of vintage and modern treasures gathered from around the world. Included in these treasures are the gallery owners themselves, Cynthia and Kirk Verseman, and the story of their business together goes back as far as some of their vintage finds.

Both Cynthia and Kirk's families have lived in the St. Louis area for generations (Kirk's family goes back to pre-civil war times, Cindy is a 4th generation St. Louisan). Their two families were friends, gathering socially, and attending the same church and school. Teen-aged Cynthia recalls working summers at her father's famous family business, Ted Drewes Frozen Custard in St. Louis, and watching Kirk drive up with a girl or two in his Triumph Spitfire.

In college Kirk sold Ted Drewes Christmas trees. It was after college that the two began dating and were married. The following 40 years included adding 3 children, Cynthia's career teaching autistic and PreK children, and Kirk's work at Enterprise Leasing and then at his family business, Missouri Floor. From life in their penthouse in the Shaw neighborhood, frequent trips across the bridge eventually led to Elsah, and the rental of the stone Ward-Rockabrand house, and then the purchase of the beautiful Onetto-Bradley brick house.





Following their dream of Kirk's to run an art gallery, and Cynthia's to have an antiques store, when a space opened up in 2019, two doors down from their home, Elsah Galleries was born. The shop is an expression of their wide-ranging interests, full of a variety of their discoveries; unique hand-picked furniture, lamps, rugs, pillows, china, old and new home decor accessories, along with serious antique pieces, a large varied gallery of paintings, prints, sculpture, and photography, all reflecting their creative eye. "Everything has a story", Cynthia explains.

This month, holiday treats and treasures will also be for sale, from useful items like wrapping paper, fanciful holiday decorations and more. All during December until year's end, many items will be offered with special sale prices. Although inventory values vary widely, all are fairly priced. Kirk shares his belief that "If you get something for a good deal, you should pass that good deal on."
